

Planting a Tree Next Spring? Plant the Right Tree

It's important to plant the right tree in the right place to reduce the potential for power outages. Follow these tips:

- Trees that grow tall should never be planted near power lines
- Never trim a tree that is growing near a power line. Consult a professional.
- Don't plant trees or shrubs near power poles. Doing so could hamper the flow of electricity, and may slow or interfere with the restoration process in the event of a power outage.



This is a wonderful story of Sudbrook's origins and its evolution as a planned suburban village designed in 1889 by Frederick Law Olmsted Sr., America's first landscape architect. The soft cover book is 248 pages with many archival photos of the neighborhood and illustrations. Each book is \$26.20 (\$24.95 plus tax).




Another great book on Sudbrook Park is ***Way Back When in Sudbrook Park***, by Beryl Frank.

It is a richly textured account of some of the people who chose to settle in Sudbrook Park and the houses they built for themselves. Mrs. Frank's colorful vignettes recount life in early twentieth century Sudbrook Park and bring to life traditions that have continued from the early days of our community to the present. The price for this soft cover book of 72 pages with black and white photographs is \$13.60 (\$12.95 plus tax).

Alert to Possible Census Scams

In April, U.S. Census workers began verifying the addresses of households across the country. Unfortunately, people may also be contacted by scammers impersonating Census workers in order to gain access to sensitive financial information such as Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers. The big question is, how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? The Better Business Bureau offers the following advice:

If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag and a confidentiality notice. **Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions.** Remember, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. **Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone,** even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census.

Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail or in person at home. They will not contact you by e-mail, so be on the look out for e-mail scams impersonating the Census. **Never click on a link or open any attachments in an e-mail that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.**

Historic District Requirements and Benefits

If you live in the Sudbrook Park County Historic District and are selling your home, remember that Baltimore County law requires you or your agent to inform the prospective purchaser that:

1. The house is in a county historic district, and
2. Owners must get approval from the Baltimore County Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) before making ANY exterior changes to the property.

Don't forget to tell purchasers about applicable historic tax credits available for pre-approved rehabilitation and upgrading of homes within the National Register and/or County Historic Districts.


If your property is within the county historic district and you are uncertain whether an exterior change requires review and approval, remember: When in doubt, ask. Always check before signing contracts or initiating work.

The LPC can insist that projects be removed if they are initiated without required approvals, and the process can result in fines for persons who violate these laws.

Our Landmarks Committee meets monthly and will be happy to provide information to assist you through the regulatory process. Call or email Charles Locke, Chair of the Sudbrook Landmarks Committee (410-580-0342 or landmarks@sudbrookpark.org), if you have questions or want additional information. Our local committee can also give you information about the State and County Historic Tax Credits.

Detailed information on review requirements and tax credits also can be found in the Homeowner's Guide section of our website: www.sudbrookpark.org.

IMPORTANT HISTORIC TAX CREDIT NOTICE: Due to staff shortages and volume, the Maryland Historical Trust is taking four months or more to respond to approval requests for the State historic tax credit, so early submission is advised.
