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Sudbrook Park's Annual Dumpster Day is May 2nd, 8:00 am to Noon

Once again Sudbrook Park will offer residents an opportunity to dispose of rubbish you've cleaned out during spring cleaning efforts. On Saturday, May 2, there will be dumpsters located at the intersection of Westover and Greenwood Roads from 8:00 am until Noon, or until the dumpsters are filled. **There is no drop-off after the Noon deadline. Any dumping after that time is considered illegal!**

There will be two containers for general refuse, one container for yard waste and brush (*no lumber*) and a fourth container for metal items, including appliances that do not contain freon. Lawn mowers are accepted only with all gas and oil removed.

The following items **ARE NOT** accepted:

- ✗ Materials you can dispose of curb side (*paper, cardboard, bottles and cans*)
- ✗ Air conditioners, refrigerators, or anything containing freon
- ✗ Liquids (*paint, acids, caustics, pesticides, chemicals, antifreeze, oil, gasoline*)
- ✗ Wood logs larger than 8" in diameter or 6' long ✗ Large stumps
- ✗ Asphalt, concrete, rock ✗ Roofing shingles
- ✗ Medical/radioactive waste ✗ Explosive or flammable materials
- ✗ Drums or tanks (*unless clean and cut in half*) ✗ Tires ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Asbestos shingles or other asbestos materials ✗ Animal carcasses

Attention Young Residents... Volunteer to help monitor the dumpsters. This is an excellent opportunity to fulfill community service hours!

Volunteers with trucks also needed to take electronics to the Warren Rd. Facility, and possibly paints and liquids to the Eastern Landfill facility in White Marsh. If you can volunteer in to help out *any* way, contact Steven Doll at 410.215.3517.

Volunteer to Help Spruce-Up the Neighborhood on May 3rd

Okay, Sudbrook Park is helping you out on Dumpster Day. Why not return the favor by donating a small amount of your time the following day to help spruce-up the neighborhood?!

Neighborhood Spruce-Up Day will be held on **Sunday, May 3rd** (weather permitting; but, we do work in drizzle!). We'll be meeting at **1:00 pm at the Sudbrook/Cliveden triangle** – where the community bulletin board is. Please bring your own work gloves; we'll provide trash bags.

Areas that we intend to focus include the litter on Greenwood Road (around the S curve) and on both ends of Howard Road, as well as, leaf debris around several triangles and the bridge, and litter along stream in the park.

This is a great opportunity for school age kids to fulfill community service requirements – however, they should be accompanied by an adult. We'll be serving refreshments afterwards – so come out and give a hand! Do your part to help keep Sudbrook Park beautiful.

Pet Peeves

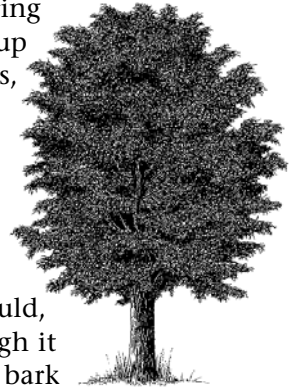
Have you ever stepped in a dog “pod” in your yard, along our public open spaces, or at our playground? If so, then you know the disgusting feeling. The Baltimore County Code requires animal owners to be responsible for the removal of their animal’s excreta deposited on public or private property (BCC 22-46). **Please be considerate of your neighbors and always pick up after your pets.** Try this pet pick-up tip: When walking your dog, put a plastic sandwich baggie (or a newspaper bag) over your hand, pick up the waste, pull the baggie inside out over your hand and then dispose when you get home.

The County Code also requires **that all dogs and cats must be walked on a leash when off the owner’s property.** If chained outside, chains must have swivels. Chain collars may not be used, except when training.

If you have any questions, need to report a problem, or want additional information concerning Baltimore County animal regulations, call Animal Control at 410.887.5961. You can call this number 24 hours a day.

In Case You Were Wondering... Yes, Ivy Will Kill Your Tree.

Did you know that ivy left unchecked will eventually kill your trees? Not only does it transmit disease, but it also deprives tree leaves of needed sunlight, and burdens the entire tree with its weight, making lower limbs susceptible to breaking-off during storms. Typically, as the vine grows up the tree, the tree loses its lower limbs, leaving a “broccoli head” canopy at the remaining top part.



Do you part to protect our tree canopy by not letting ivy grow up your trees unchecked. Cutting the roots of the ivy at the tree base should, in most cases, kill the plant, although it may continue to live off of the tree bark for several more months. Entranceway Walk Paths

We have previously asked for and are hoping to get walk paths through the entranceway area for pedestrian safety along that stretch of Sudbrook Lane. Although funding is tight, we hope the county will provide simple asphalt paths for pedestrians. Until we are able to achieve this goal, we strongly suggest, for safety, that you walk on the grass in the triangles rather than on the actual road. We will keep you informed on our progress regarding the installation of a walking path.

Unplug Electronic Appliances Not Used Everyday.

Many electronic devices and appliances (e.g. cell phone and battery chargers, TVs, VCRs, DVD players, microwaves, computers, stereo systems, etc.) that have clocks, or use "standby power" through plug-in transformers are still capable of using small traces of electricity even if the device or appliance is not on.

While these devices may each use just 3 to 5 watts an hour, multiply that over a 24-hour day, times the 6 to 10 devices in a typical home, and you see the amount of power wasted each day for appliances that aren't even on.

Simply unplug anything electronic, if it will be more than a day before you plan to reuse the appliance. A good solution is to plug several of these types of devices into a power strip that has an on/off switch to turn off an entire cluster of items at once.

Baltimore County to Host a Two Day Compost Bin Sale. What better way to celebrate Earth Day on April 22, and the arrival of spring than by starting a journey into the world of home composting?

For the first time ever, the County will host a two-day truck-load compost bin sale – Saturday, April 18 and Sunday, April 19, 2009. Compost bins – valued at \$80 – will be available for \$35 including tax (*only cash or checks will be accepted.*) The Saturday sale will be held on the parking lot of IKEA in White Marsh, 8352 Honeygo Boulevard (*across from White Marsh Town Center*). The Sunday sale will be held on the parking lot of Franklin High School in Reisterstown, 12000 Reisterstown Road. Both sales will run from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, rain or shine, and bins will be available on a first come, first served basis.

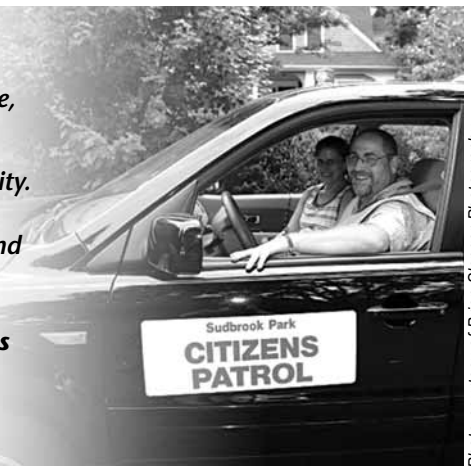
